

Topic – Jamaica and Our Wonderful World

Students have been exploring Jamaica in geography and will finish this topic in the next two weeks. After our Jamaica topic Robin Class will explore our wonderful world. Students will begin by being able to name, locate and identify the characteristics of the seven continents and oceans. Students will be able to use world maps, atlases and globes. Pupils will expand on this knowledge by researching the Seven Wonders of the World. Students will also listen to 'What a Wonderful World' by Louis Armstrong and compose some of their own verses.



English

Students will begin the term exploring a book called Quest which is the next one after Journey, by Aaron Becker. This book has no text so the story is open to unique individual interpretation of the pictures, drawing on experiences and imagination. Students will use this book as inspiration to write their own comic strip after exploring settings, feelings and potential narratives within the book.



Science

This term we will be exploring all about animals and their habitats. Last term we explored different bird species and completed challenges to gain the Ruby Robin Award. Students also joined a live presentation by the Blue Cross to learn about domestic animals and their needs. This term we will explore wildlife, ocean animals and the life cycle. When exploring different habitats students will begin to identify common trees within the area.
