Maths

We will begin our term exploring the composition of multiples of 10 up to 100. We will then move on to composition of numbers 20—100.

English

We will have daily phonics lessons, following the Read Write Inc programme - most of us will be working on using our set 2 sounds to help us read words and to become more fluent readers. In our writing lessons, we will begin by focusing on the story 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch'. We will make a prediction of the



story first, recognising past tense vocabulary and begin using the suffix 'ed'. Our writing focus will be to write simple sentences, using our phonics knowledge to help us spell words phonetically correct. We will practice using finger spaces between words and use capital letters and full stops in our sentences.

RE

Our key question is 'What do Muslims believe?'

Our focus for this half term will be developing our knowledge and understanding of the Muslim faith.

After the half term pupils will be finding out why Easter is important to Christians.

Science - Every day Materials and Seasons Walk

As part of our science learning, we will be taking notice of the changing seasons through the year. In January and March, we will go on a seasons walk along the track at the back of school so pupils will need to bring wellies or old trainers on these days. More information will be sent with regards to dates soon.
