Topic - Our Amazing Country

In our geography learning, we will be exploring the question What makes up the United Kingdom? We will learn about the four countries that make up the UK, along with the capital cities of each. Our studies will include key physical features such as beaches, coasts, forests, hills, mountains, oceans, and rivers, as well as how the weather can vary across the UK. We will also explore key human features—cities, towns, villages, factories, farms, houses, offices, and shops—and compare how these are similar or different in each country. Additionally, we will learn how to use an atlas to locate the countries and surrounding seas of the UK.

English

In Year 1, we will continue daily phonics lessons using the Read Write Inc. programme, revising sounds to improve reading accuracy and fluency. After the Phonics Screening Check in June, we'll focus on fluency and simple retrieval questions. Reading at home at least three times a week and signing reading records helps reinforce learning and builds confidence. In writing, we'll begin with Jack and the Beanstalk and move on to Handa's Surprise. We'll focus on using questions, adding suffixes (-ed, -ing, -er, -est), and joining clauses with and. We'll also keep practising sentence basics: capital letters, full stops and spaces. In handwriting, we'll use the 'three friends' grip, focus on correct letter formation, and build writing stamina through our 'power packs'.

Science

In our science lessons this half term, we will continue our work on the seasons. As part of this, we will go on a seasonal walk to observe how the environment has changed from autumn to spring and into summer. We will also begin learning about plants, exploring the structure of a plant and the important roles each part plays. We will learn to identify a variety of different plants and trees, and understand the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees.



Newsletter - Summer Term 2025

Year 1

Welcome to the Year 1 Curriculum Newsletter. This is a summary of the learning planned for the Summer Term.

Maths

In our maths lessons this term, we will continue exploring the composition of numbers from 20 to 100. We'll focus on counting efficiently by making groups of ten and understanding that the relative size of twodigit numbers can be identified by first comparing the tens digit, and then the ones digit if needed. We will also learn how to partition two-digit numbers into tens and ones, and how this can support addition strategies. We will then move on to the composition of numbers from 11 to 19. We'll explore how even one-digit numbers can be made from groups of two, and how doubling numbers from 6 to 9 results in teen numbers. We'll also learn that halving an even teen number gives a result between 6 and 9. In addition, we'll apply our knowledge of number facts within 10 to solve addition and subtraction problems within 20.

RE

Our topic for the term will be focused on answering the question 'What is the good news that Jesus brings?' We will explore how peace is good news for Christians and how Christians put friendship and forgiveness into practice.

PE

This term, Year 1 will have PE lessons on Wednesday and Friday afternoons so please make sure your PE kit is in school on these days. Please remember to take earrings out for school on PE days. The focus of our PE lessons will be games and athletics skills.

Computing

We will begin exploring early programming concepts by learning how to use individual commands and understanding what each command does for the robot. This knowledge will help us predict the outcomes of programs. Next, we will introduce onscreen programming using ScratchJr. We'll investigate how a project is structured by looking at sprites and backgrounds, and we'll start using programming blocks to create our own programs.
