- Describe how the mouse might be feeling at different parts of the story
- Complete speech bubbles showing what the Gruffalo might be saying related to his feelings

• Animal sorting in the role play area

Habitats

UW

- Make your own insect habitat select your own materials and create your own design
- Visit the habit trail and discuss your learning in the classroom beginning to speak in full sentences using some newly introduced language

EAD

- Junk model a woodland scene
- Talk about what you should include in your scene and why
- Link what you've seen on your woodland walk to your choices in the woodland scene you make

Seasons

UW

- Observe and discuss changes in the weather
- Complete daily weather/seasons board
- Complete cut and stick outfit changes related to the weather

- Identify the different colours that link to the different seasons
- Draw or paint your interpretation of each season
- Discuss your choice of colours and materials explain why you've made certain choices
- Look at designs and discuss what you would do differently or what you could add or change
