EQUALITY OBJECTIVES

In order to further support pupils, raise standards and ensure inclusive teaching, we have set the following objectives:

<u>Objective 2</u> To enable all children to access a broad and balanced curriculum regardless of their protected characteristics. (Curriculum and School Improvement meetings, FGB meetings, newsletters, curriculum newsletters)

<u>Objective 3</u> To monitor the school environment to ensure it is as accessible as possible to pupils, staff and visitors. (Accessibility Plan)

Objective 4 To ensure the relationship and sex education, and health education curriculum continues to meet both the statutory guidance and the needs of different cohorts. (Curriculum and School Improvement minutes, Link Governor feedback)
