Topic

Our topic this term will be 'Angle-Land'. Our history learning will focus on the history of the Anglo-Saxons, in which we will find out more about life in Britain during those times, using Anglo-Saxon artefacts! During our topic lessons, we will use the Anglo-Saxon story of



Beowulf for writing opportunities alongside creating our own Beowulf paintings in our art lessons.

Maths


In our maths lessons this term, we will be learning to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. We will work on our understanding of different methods to solve multiplication and division problems when dividing by 10 and 100. We will then move on to short multiplication and division using our knowledge of timetables to support us in our Computing understanding.

Club sheets will continue to be tested weekly. It would also be extremely useful for us to practice our times tables using Times Table Rock Stars on a regular basis.

We will consolidate for the four calculations through daily Fluent in Five sessions and a weekly arithmetic lesson.

English

In our writing lessons this term, we will use our topic learning to support us in writing a non-chronological report based on Anglo-Saxons. We will also use the story of Beowulf for both retell and descriptive writing. Our main focus will be to improve the use of fronted adverbials and inverted commas for speech, in preparation for moving up to Year 5.



Science

In the first half-term, we will be learning about living things and using classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things. In the second half-term, we will be exploring basic parts of the digestive system, exploring teeth and their function and exploring producers, predators and prey in food chains.

Music

On Tuesday mornings, we will continue to learn how to play a ukulele as part of our music lessons. Please ensure ukuleles are in school on these days.



In computing, we will be learning about how to use repeat and loop commands to design a project.
